These meetings will also be summarized in our newsletter that follows the two meetings.

Also, talk to your fellow teachers and make sure that they are part of the discussion through a decision to be a member of NETA (this is not expensive! and the gesture of support is meaningful). Go ahead and ask your teacher-friend if they a member of NETA. If not, please ask them to join. We want to have the largest and most diverse membership possible. You can help to make that a reality. Bring a fellow teacher to the meetings and see if we can get them to be a part of the future of great embroidery education. ANG has actually stopped hiring non-US teachers for the time being to cut the cost of putting on a seminar.
